Many scholars believe the original poem was composed in an oral tradition by an *aoidos* (epic poet/singer), perhaps a rhapsode (professional performer), and was more likely intended to be heard than read. The details of the ancient oral performance and the story's conversion to a written work inspire continual debate among scholars. The Odyssey was written in a poetic dialect of Greek, a literary amalgam of Aeolic Greek, Ionic Greek, and other Ancient Greek dialects, and comprises 12,110 lines of dactylic hexameter. Among the most noteworthy elements of the text are its non-linear plot and the influence on events of choices made by women and slaves, besides the actions of fighting men. In the English language, as well as many others, the word *Odyssey* has come to refer to an epic voyage.
