

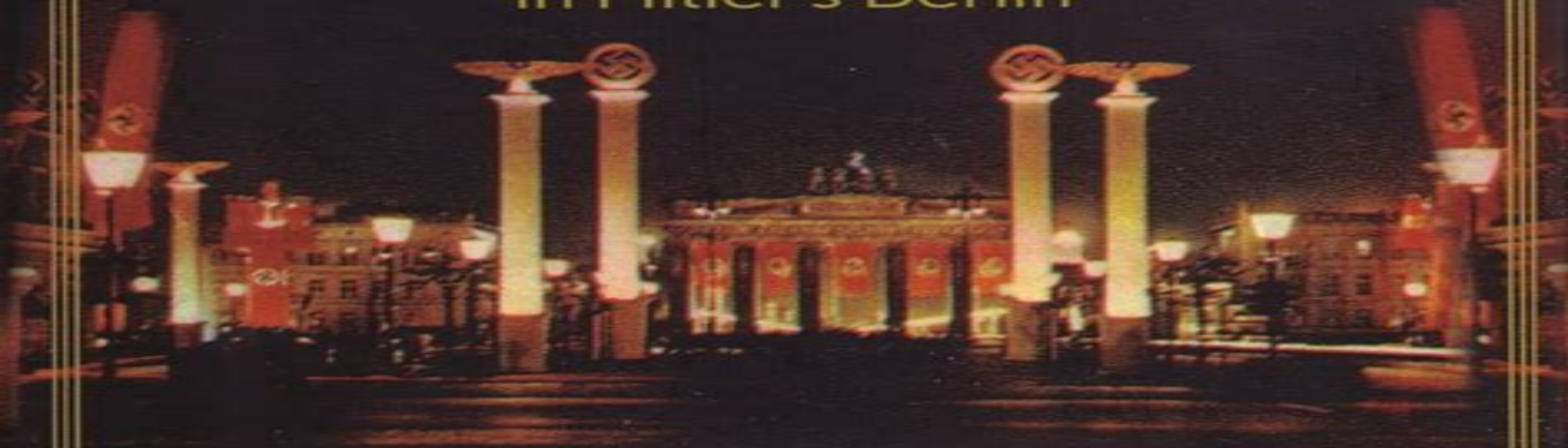

Nicholas Roerich John McCannon, 2022-11-15 Russian painter explorer and mystic Nicholas Roerich 1874 1947 ranks as one of the twentieth century s great enigmas Despite mystery and scandal he left a deep if understudied cultural imprint on Russia Europe India and America As a painter and set designer Roerich was a key figure in Russian art He became a major player in Diaghilev s Ballets Russes and with Igor Stravinsky he cocreated The Rite of Spring a landmark work in the emergence of artistic modernity His art his adventures and his peace activism earned the friendship and admiration of such diverse luminaries as Albert Einstein Eleanor Roosevelt H G Wells Jawaharlal Nehru Raisa Gorbacheva and H P Lovecraft But the artist also had a darker side Stravinsky once said of Roerich that he ought to have been a mystic or a spy He was certainly the former and close enough to the latter to blur any distinction His travels to Asia supposedly motivated by artistic interests and archaeological research were in fact covert attempts to create a pan Buddhist state encompassing Siberia Mongolia and Tibet His activities in America touched Franklin Delano Roosevelt s cabinet with scandal and behind the scenes affected the course of three US presidential elections In his lifetime Roerich baffled foreign affairs ministries and intelligence services in half a dozen countries He persuaded thousands that he was a humanitarian and divinely inspired thinker but convinced just as many that he was a fraud or a madman His story reads like an epic work of fiction and is all the more remarkable for being true John McCannon s engaging and scrupulously researched narrative moves beyond traditional perceptions of Roerich as a saint or a villain to show that he was in many ways both in equal measure

the Dutch internment camps in the East Indies were treated by their captors These documents are supported by evidence from contemporary witnesses The author has encapsulated his many years of research in the two volumes of Hitler s Asian Adventure It is a fascinating documentation of the German Navy s involvement in a theatre of war that has until now been neglected by historians

or remembered today yet he was one of the most influential figures of the Wilson presidency Wilson's chief political advisor House played a key role in international diplomacy and had a significant hand in crafting the Fourteen Points at the Paris Peace Conference Though the intimate friendship between the president and his advisor ultimately unraveled in the wake of these negotiations House's role in the Wilson administration had a lasting impact on 20th century international politics In this seminal biography Charles E Neu details the life of Colonel House a Texas landowner who rose to become one of the century's greatest political operators Ambitious and persuasive House worked largely behind the scenes developing ties of loyalty and using patronage to rally party workers behind his candidates In 1911 he met Woodrow Wilson and almost immediately the two formed what would become one of the most famous friendships in American political history House became a high level political intermediary in the Wilson administration proving particularly adept at managing the intangible realm of human relations After World War I erupted House realizing the complexity of the struggle and the dangers and opportunities it posed for the United States began traveling to and from Europe as the president's personal representative Eventually he helped Wilson recognize the need to devise a way to end the war that would place the United States at the center of a new world order In this balanced account Neu shows that while House was a resourceful and imaginative diplomat his analysis of wartime politics was erratic He relied too heavily on personal contacts often exaggerating his accomplishments and missing the larger historical forces that shaped the policies of the warring powers Ultimately as the Paris Peace Conference unfolded differences appeared between Wilson and his counselor Their divergent views on the negotiations led to a bitter split and after the president left France in June of 1919 he would never see House again Despite this break Neu refutes the idea that Wilson and House were antagonists They shared the same beliefs and aspirations and were Neu shows part of an unusual partnership As an organizer tactician and confidant House helped to make possible Wilson's achievements and this impressive biography restores the enigmatic counselor to his place at the center of that presidency
