He persuaded thousands that he was a humanitarian and divinely inspired thinker but convinced just as many that he was a fraud or a madman His story reads like an epic work of fiction and is all the more remarkable for being true John McCannon's engaging and scrupulously researched narrative moves beyond traditional perceptions of Roerich as a saint or a villain to show that he was in many ways both in equal **Racism and the Olympics** Robert G.
