Vaughn, Mattie Campbell Davis, 2006 The Dallas County Voters League an organisation comprised primarily of black men began seeking avenues in the 1940s to gradually transform the oppressive environments in which they lived The quiet protracted Civil Rights struggle culminated in 1963 when black students from Hudson High School in Selma became pivotal participants in launching the public movement The Selma campaign was in jeopardy in late 1964 so local leaders invited Martin Luther King to assist them The rest as they say is history *Selma* Sharon J. Pratt,2017-01-31 The march from Selma to Montgomery starkly illustrated the claims of the civil rights movement and the raw brutality of the forces arrayed against it On Sunday afternoon March 7 1965 roughly six hundred peaceful demonstrators set out from Brown Chapel A M E Church in a double file column to march from Selma Alabama to the state capital of Montgomery Leading the march were Hosea
