Haydn -- The Complete Piano Sonatas, Vol 2 Maurice Hinson, 1995-08 These three volumes in practical urtext pedagogical editions are designed with the idea that these precious works will be performed on the modern piano With respect to the original text Dr Hinson offers many valuable stylistically faithful suggestions for interpretation Volume I is appropriate for progressing intermediate students and provides a most effective introduction to the great Viennese Classical style The comb binding creates a lay flat book that is perfect for study and performance Analysis of 18th- and 19th-century Musical Works in the Classical Tradition David Beach, Ryan C.
