

USER STORY

What always starts with the pain of a user.

- ✦ A user story (or simply a story) is the smallest unit of the requirement delivering a business value in an agile framework.
- ✦ A user story answers the question **What? For Who? And Why?**
- ✦ Most important part of User Story is the conversation around it.
- ✦ A user story describes a request from the perspective of the person who desires the new capability.
- ✦ The goal of a user story is to deliver a particular value back to the customer.
- ✦ Describes requirements in a few simple sentences in a structured template and it is easy to understand and ideally using non-technical language.
- ✦ It's a typical item of the Product Backlog where it is often represented as a card in physical form.
- ✦ Ideally fulfills INVEST principle.
- ✦ Written in role-feature-reason format **As a < type of user >, I want < some goal > so that < some reason >.**
- ✦ Acceptance criteria are added to the User Story, which better identifies expected outcome.
- ✦ Consists of subtasks, created by the development team to achieve successful implementation.
- ✦ Recommended structure of subtasks:
Analyses, Implementation tasks, Testing, Review, Documentation, Acceptance
- ✦ Product owner defines user stories while team defines subtasks.
- ✦ An example might be 'Validate VISA card, Search by product category, Choose team member in the Timesheet report.'
