Thinking with Kierkegaard Arne Grøn, 2022-12-31 Arne Grøn's reading of Søren Kierkegaard's authorship revolves around existential challenges of human identity. This book should be of interest to philosophers, theologians, literary studies scholars, and anyone with an interest not only in Kierkegaard but also in human identity.
