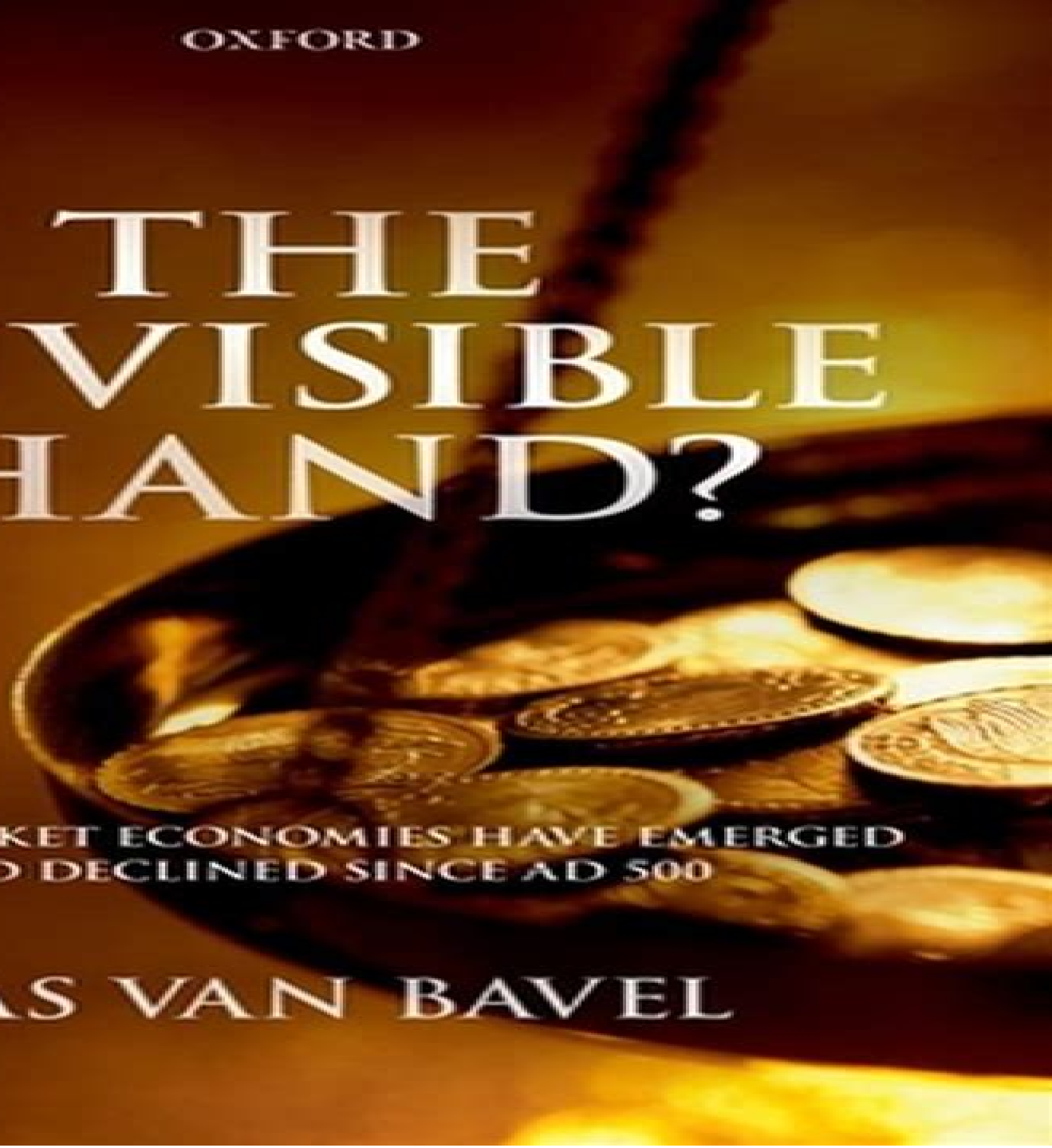

Holcombe, 2020-07-23 There are two ways people coordinate their actions through cooperation exercised by economic power and through control exercised by political power When economic and political power are held by the same people the result is stagnation when those who hold economic power are not the same people who hold political power the result is progress This book presents the ways in which economic power and political power can be separated and how they can remain so by analyzing the nature of power and the differences between economic and political power The book then discusses the history of economic and political power including hunter gatherer societies agrarian societies and modern commercial and industrial societies This background lends insight into why political and economic power were typically held by the same people and why recently those without political power have been able to acquire economic power Incentives play a key role in understanding how those two types of power can become separated and why there is always a tendency for them to recombine But ideas also play a crucial role including the influence of the Enlightenment on the progress that has occurred in the last several hundred years

The Wealth of a Nation Geoffrey M. The Moral and Market Economies of Bread Jonas Albrecht, 2024-06-13 From the 1770s the Vienna bread market was rocked by a series of politico economic and technological changes that questioned the way this everyday foodstuff was sold and produced In this book Jonas Albrecht explores how this reconfiguration of the bread market had wide reaching and significant consequences for a society who relied on this foodstuff to live Before 1860 the production and selling of bread was embedded into a moral economy with distinct regulations But as the grain market expanded and new cereal varieties arrived from the empire's peripheries reformers sought to create a free market through liberalizing reforms *The Moral and Market Economies of Bread* shows that while terminating market regulation did mobilize and diversify Vienna's bread market in spatial terms it intensified inequality among consumers As opaque prices non transparent market procedures and diverging power relations between producers and consumers led to unrest city officials and bakers struggled to meet the shortcomings of the free market from within This book brings economic social and urban histories together and employs a spatial approach and GIS methods to explore the relationship between market and society and capitalism at large

Governing Least Dan Moller, 2019 This book argues that political libertarianism can be grounded in widely shared everyday moral beliefs particularly in strictures against shifting our burdens onto others It also seeks to connect these philosophical arguments with related work in economics history and politics for a wide ranging discussion of political economy

Political Capitalism Randall G. Holcombe, 2018-07-19 Problems associated with cronyism corporatism and policies that favor the elite over the masses have received increasing attention in recent years Political Capitalism explains that what people often view as the result of corruption and unethical behavior are symptoms of a distinct system of political economy The symptoms of political capitalism are often viewed as the result of government intervention in a market economy or as attributes of a capitalist economy itself Randall G Holcombe combines well established theories in economics and the social sciences to show that political capitalism is not a mixed economy or government intervention in a market economy or some intermediate step between capitalism and socialism After developing the economic theory of political capitalism Holcombe goes on to explain how changes in political ideology have facilitated the growth of political capitalism

Italy Thomas Kuehn, 2022-03-03 Family was a central feature of social life in Italian cities In the Renaissance jurists humanists and moralists began to theorize on the relations between people and property that formed the substance of the family and what held it together over the years Family property was a bundle of shared rights This was most evident when brothers shared a household and enterprise but it also faced overlapping claims from children and wives which the paterfamilias had to recognize Thomas Kuehn explores patrimony in legal thought and how property was inherited managed and shared in Renaissance Italy Managing a patrimony was not a simple task This led to a complex and active conceptualization of shared rights and a conscious application of devices in the law that could override liabilities and preserve the group or carve out distinct shares for each member This wide ranging volume charts the ever present conflicts that arose and were a constant feature of family life *Restarting the Future* Jonathan Haskel, Stian Westlake, 2023-10-03 *Restarting the Future* argues that the big economic challenges facing the world are the result of our failure to deal with the implications of an economy dependent on knowledge ideas and relationships It examines why making this transition is so hard and looks at ways forward in the fields of public policy business and finance The troubling state of rich world economies low productivity growth high inequality populist instability climate crisis is significantly the result of the troubled and incomplete shift to a new type of economy specifically the move from an economy dependent on tangible capital to one dependent on intangible capital At the heart of the problem is a significant slowdown in the pace of intangible investment since the financial crisis There were some early signs of this at the time the authors were writing their previous book *Capitalism without Capital* but new data now makes the severity and persistence of this slowdown clear This slowdown has happened because we lack the right institutions and strategies to encourage intangible investment and channel it effectively What is more there are significant groups with an interest in stopping these new institutions emerging Contrary to the dominant narrative that focuses on the tension between a successful future facing elite and a mass of low status left behinds the authors argue that many of the people and organisations with an interest in holding back the future are affluent and high status including affluent retirees established financial institutions and graduate knowledge workers Haskel Westlake survey attempts to fix these institutional problems explaining how they work in the context of the intangible economy and what the upside to solving them might be They describe interesting and topical policy experiments and business strategies such as Preston's Local Economic Strategy or topical new business models like WeWork and CloudKitchens and set them in a novel economic context Specifically these sections look at city policy business finance and investment public investment competition policy monetary policy mitigating climate change and business strategies for tangible based firms The authors close the book with a political programme for how to get over the teething troubles of the new economy Methods in Premodern Economic History Ulla Kypta, Julia Bruch, Tanja Skambraks, 2019-10-15 This edited collection demonstrates how

Societal Problems as Public Bads Nan de Graaf, Dingeman Wiertz, 2019-05-10 Corruption crime economic inequality religious fundamentalism financial crises environmental degradation population ageing gender inequality large scale migration This book tackles many of the most pressing problems facing societies today The authors demonstrate that similar social mechanisms lie behind many of these seemingly disparate problems Indeed many societal problems can be traced back to behaviours that are perfectly rational and often well intended from an individual perspective Yet taken together these behaviours can paradoxically give rise to unintended and undesirable outcomes at the society level In addition to addressing the causes of societal problems the book explains why some problems rank higher on the public agenda than others Moreover it is shown how government intervention may sometimes provide a cure yet other times exacerbate existing problems or create new problems of its own This book includes an extensive amount of data on trends and geographic variation in the prevalence of different problems as well as telling examples both recent and historical from a variety of countries to support its key arguments Employing a bold multidisciplinary approach the authors draw on insights from across the social sciences including sociology economics anthropology criminology and psychology Throughout the book students are introduced to analytical concepts such as free riding herding behaviour principal agent relations and moral hazard These concepts are essential tools for better understanding the roots of many societal problems that regularly make headlines in the news This improved understanding will in turn be critical for ultimately finding solutions to these problems

and inequality The aftermath of the Conquest brought about a complete restructuring of the economy as a result of death from disease the introduction of European style agriculture and a more intensive exploitation of the peasantry The eighteenth and nineteenth centuries saw reform followed by a series of crises and rebellions under which sustained economic growth was impossible Globalization and the expansion of agricultural exports provided some opportunities in the late nineteenth and twentieth centuries but they failed to provide the booming rural population with a sustainable means of supporting domestic demand The so called Mexican Miracle the period of rapid growth in the 1950s 1960s and early 1970s disguised a failure to address the economic inequality embedded since the colonial period As this book clearly demonstrates this inequality was sometimes challenged in Mexican history but never decisively addressed let alone reversed This accessible and engaging book is vital reading for students and scholars of the history of Mexico and Latin America and those interested in economic development in historical perspective
