Across Asserica, aniddle-class and upper-uniddle-class gated communities are creating new forms of exclusions and residencial segregation, exacerbating social cleavages that already exist (Blakely and Soyder 1997; Higley 1995; Lang and Danielson 1997; Marcose (997). While historically secured and gated communities were built in the United States to protect exacts and to contain the leisure world of settrees, these urbso and suburban developments now target a much broader market, including families with children (Guterson 1992; Lufland 1998). For a majority of Americans the distance from suburb to city, or from week to home, is maintained through a complex social discourse. Anti-urban sentiment is often expressed as fear of violence and crime that is said to pervade the city. Within eared communities, though, the intensity of the discourse of urban fear suggests other underlying socictal explanations. In this study, I explore the complex interestrangerions between this discourse, loss of a sense of place, and increasing class separation.
